Dear Parents / Carers,

As we reach the end of an unusual term at Worplesdon, we want to take the opportunity to say a huge 'Well Done' to the children in Year 3. Their ability to adapt to the changing circumstances has demonstrated to us all how they are living the school values:

Resilience - keeping going even when the work is challenging.

Perseverance - working through all the technical challenges.

Teamwork - working with parents and siblings to understand the tasks and work through them.

Independence - completing work and uploading it onto the classroom.

In English, the children have invented their own version of 'Mega City' using the video clip to support them. There are resources and videoclips on the classroom site and Mrs Connor has made a video to model the strategy we are teaching the children. We encourage the children to use the answer sheet (after they have finished) so they can self mark and correct any errors themselves.

As we are nearing Easter, we wanted to give the children the opportunity to complete their learning of this important festival and there were lots of activities on the classroom to support this as part of our Easter Religious Education Day.
