Thank you for your ongoing support so far, as a team we wanted to take this opportunity to share some information about Year 3 teaching and learning this year. As part of the government's action on returning children of key workers and vulnerable pupils to the school setting (and also Reception, Year 1 and year 6). We now have two bubbles in Year 3 (Lime and Green) which are being staffed full time by Miss Bennett, Mr Bowers, Miss Connor and Mrs Buck. We are so lucky in Year 3, to have the most amazing team members so if you are home learning, you may receive feedback from Mrs Herzig, Mrs Hopkins, Mrs Nightingale and Mrs Woodruff. It is our priority that ALL children and families in Year 3 receive quality feedback and support on their learning.

We wholly appreciate that these times are unusual and that some families are finding the ongoing situation challenging. As a team, we are looking to ensure planning is manageable for all and whilst ensuring lesson content follows national curriculum expectation, lessons are engaging and interesting for pupils.

Alongside the weekly overview, we will be sharing a tip sheet to support you with delivering home learning and to give you ideas for keeping the children motivated through these last few weeks of term.

This week in Maths, we have been consolidating our learning about Time and converting between digital and analogue clocks. In English, we have been focusing on sentence structure and poetry. In the Foundation subjects we have discussed Valuing Differences, created nature inspired artwork and used scientific evidence to answer questions in Science.

You will be aware that Fire House were the House Point winners, we will be organising a Scavenger Hunt via Google Meet for the children in Fire House, so look out for a link on the Year 3 stream.

Just another reminder that in the next few weeks we are hoping to teach Design and Technology. We aim for the children to design and build a photo frame for practical use. If you could begin/continue to collate a bundle of resources such as cardboard/cereal boxes, plastic bottles, tissue paper etc that would be fantastic.
