In English this week, we have continued our unit of work based on the Mr Men characters. The children have created their own stories based on an existing Mr Men characters and they are all very creative!

In maths this week, the children have been growing in confidence with ratio and proportion. It is such an important skill that links in with daily life and will help support them in their Secondary Maths lessons.
