Dear Parents / Carers,

We hope you have had a lovely week. The children are continuing to come into school happily and increasingly confidently. We are so impressed with their personal organisation skills and their hard work in lessons.

This week in English, we have continuing with our unit on the text 'The Day the Crayons Quit', this unit will focus on the skill of using conjunctions to extend sentences. The children are now tweaking the story and have been creating their own text map. In Maths, we have continued our focus on place value and using different representations of 2- and 3-digit numbers as well as adding and subtracting multiples of 10 and 100. In our foundation lessons we have been doing Gym in P.E and learnt about sedimentary, igneous and metamorphic rock in Science. In Computing, we are learning how to use Google Maps and in Art we are creating pieces of artwork inspired by the landscape of Guildford.

During this time, when children may be off school but able to continue school work, we are asking parents in the first instance to check the Year 3 Google Classroom as work will be uploaded as soon as possible. A separate sheet with your child's log in will be coming home next week.

We would also like to draw your attention to a range of presentations that will be available on the Year 3 Google Classroom from Monday. We will upload the presentations that we created before the summer holidays to give you more detail on the provision in place for your children in Year 3.

In Year 3, we have created Homework Passports for the children to complete at home and upload onto the Google Classroom. The passports have been designed with activities created to consolidate learning in the classroom. These will be available on the Google Classroom from Monday 21st September and we plan to celebrate the children's work in class in the week beginning 18th December.

We are encouraging children to come into school with a snack, just to remind you that we are a nut free school and items such as Nutella are not allowed in packed lunches.
