	Go for a sensory walk. What can you hear, see, smell and feel?	
	Listen to a piece of classical music (Youtube). How does it make you feel?	
	Cook something with a family member. Research the ingredients you will need and carefully prepare them.	
	Review a book you have read.	
	Do something nice for someone else. How did it make them and you feel?	
	Write and perform a poem. It can be about anything!	
	Make up a game and teach it to someone else. Can you create a list of rules?	
	Create a piece of artwork to show a UK area/ landmark.	
	Research and create a fact file about your favourite animal.	
	Make a song/ rhyme to help you remember a times table that you find tricky.	
	Try a new sport/ exercise that you haven't done before.	
	Create a dance routine to a song you like!	
	Create a map of your home, garden or a local area.	
	With support, learn how to sew a button onto some fabric! If you can already sew, use your skills to create something.	
	Interview someone about their childhood. What would you like to find out? Was their childhood different to yours?	
	Go for a walk along a river. Can you find the river on a map?
