### Swimming

We were so proud of the children's conduct and behaviour when we took them swimming at the Surrey Sports Park this week. They demonstrated excellent independence and great maturity and we think they thoroughly enjoyed the sessions. ### Curriculum

English – This week in English, we have continued to use 'The King Who Banned the Dark' as our inspiration text. This week the children brainstormed different things that the King should Ban! They came up with so many great suggestions and innovated their writing.

Maths – This week in Maths we began our teaching unit on Fractions. The children began learning about parts of a whole and halves and quarters of amount which is a recap of year 2 learning. We believe this is fundamental to build into their learning of Year 3 fractions content.

Foundation – In Foundation this week, we have covered a variety of topics. In Science, we planned an investigation into measuring the length of shadows. In RE, we have been learning about The Lord's Prayer and its importance to members of the Christian faith. In History we have been researching different houses from different time periods to analyse the changes.
