Sadly, from my own observations and feedback from local residents and parents, there are a number of issues which still haven't been resolved since my last newsflash requesting the following:


- Unsafe driving (for example: speeding; driving along paths being used by pedestrians; and an unawareness of bikes using the roads leading to very near misses).
