Curriculum

As writers we have been tweaking 'Lost and Found.' We have been using a text map to help us change the animal that the boy meets. We have been identifying the conjunctions in the text and started to think about how we could use them in our writing.

As mathematicians we have been learning about the place value of 2-digit numbers up to 20. We have been exploring how many tens and ones are teen numbers and thinking about how we can represent this in different ways. E.g. counters, Numicon, part part whole models, number sentences etc.

As artists we have been printing repeating patterns using classroom objects. We have been mixing colours and using the printing techniques of stamping, rolling, dragging etc.

As athletes we are starting a new unit called Hit, Run, Catch. This week we are rolling balls and looking for spaces. We started to be fielders and return the ball to a hoop to score points.

As Scientists we have been continuing to classify animals including humans into their animal groups. E.g. mammals, amphibians, birds etc. We have been developing our scientific reasoning using the correct vocabulary.

As computing experts we have been practising our coding skills on PurpleMash. We have been practising our resilience when debugging the code.

Phonics

In phonics we have started to learn about some of the vowel alternatives.

This week we have learnt: (ai) a ey ea eigh (ar) a (ee) e table, grey, break, sleigh, task, he

It is really helpful if the children can use the sheet that we sent home to practise the graphemes learnt. The word mats that also came home are words that children need to read and spell by the end of Year 1 so any work on these is also helpful.

The banded books that have been sent home match your child's phonic knowledge so please hear them read at least 3 times a week and record it in their reading diary.
