WEEKLY UPDATE FOR EARLY BIRDS AND NIGHT OWLS

This week at Night Owls we have been continuing our Easter activities. The children are really looking forward to the Easter holidays and have enjoyed the variety of activities on offer to them. They were able to create Easter cards, including pop up ones, which they could take home. They were also able to make a paper chick that could spring and bounce up and down.

A particular favourite, this week, was our painting table. The children could choose to paint a rabbit or a chick using paints and forks to create a lovely piece of artwork, adding features to their designs once dry. As you can see from our photos they produced wonderful pictures. In our tuff tray area, the children had paper egg templates that had been coloured in two different colours. They then had to pick a template and make the pattern they had chosen using the plastic egg halves provided that were all mixed up. They had great fun making up the different designs.

The children got creative with staff using our gym mats to make car ramps on chairs, where they had great fun whizzing cars along the ramps and seeing how far they could go. We also played Bingo, due to the bad weather and not being able to go outside some nights. The children love the challenge of trying to be the first to fill a line or the whole card and win a prize, they can get quite competitive! We can also see how beneficial it is to the younger children as well, helping them with their number recognition and learning larger numbers.

The children have a great variety of toys on offer to them but we would appreciate any kind donations of board games if anyone has any that they no longer need. We are also looking for some older children's dressing up outfits. The majority of the ones we have at the moment are only suitable for the infant children and we quite often have the junior children wanting to join in the fun.
