CHANGE OF SCHOOL TIMINGS FOR SEPTEMBER 2023

Attached to this newsflash is a formal consultation with proposed changes to the structure of the school day across the Federated Schools of Wood Street Infant School & Worplesdon Primary School:

- The government has made it compulsory that all schools must offer 32.5 hours of school per week from September 2023.
- At Worplesdon Primary School, the children already receive 32.5hrs per week with the school day being 8.40am 3.10pm for the infants and 8.50am 3.20pm for the junior children.
- At Wood Street Infant School, the current hours are 8.40am 3.00pm which equates to 6hrs 20minutes per day, totaling 31hrs 40 minutes per week. Wood Street Infant School are currently running at a 50-minute deficit each week. Therefore, the school day needs to be extended by 10 minutes per day.
- As a federation, we need to consider siblings across the two sites and would like to offer timings that could work for all families. We are aware of the impact this will have on working families and have tried to keep times that are in keeping with our current offer.

Please read through the consultation carefully. There will be an opportunity to give feedback via a survey (link to be sent 19th May).

LIVING BY OUR VALUES IN THE COMMUNITY

We continue to teach the children our school values and how they can apply these at home and beyond. With this in mind, Mrs O'Brien was delighted to have been invited to a recent FLGCA meeting at the local community centre as she is keen for the children to be able to give back to their local community. With this in mind, Worplesdon Primary School will be leading on the following:

- Litter picking: Within the school day, Mrs O'Brien will be taking a group of children litter picking before and after the Coronation celebrations. In addition, there will be an after school litter pick with the cubs later this term (details below).
- Tree planting: In collaboration with the residents of Fairlands, we are applying for a tree planting grant; (<u>Planting trees on the highway - Surrey County Council (surreycc.gov.uk)</u> which enables the Council to plant trees on grass verges for those residents wishing to prevent cars from mounting the verge. Once planted we plan for the children to be involved in caring / watering these young trees.
- Promoting respectful parking: Mrs O'Brien will be teaching the children in assemblies how parents & carers should be parking around Fairlands so that they have a secure understanding of the importance of safety on our roads. Mrs O'Brien is hopeful that the small but significant group of parents / carers who are being disrespectful with their parking will improve their parking behaviour and be role models to their children.
- Enhancing the environment: A group of children enjoyed planting in the flower boxes with Mrs Sherlock at the community centre.

WORPLESDON SCHOOL CELEBRATES THE CORONATION OF THE KING As you know the weekend of 6th-8th May we will be celebrating the

King's Coronation. As a school we would like to celebrate and mark this occasion.

On Thursday 4th May we are inviting the children to come into school wearing something red, white and / or blue.

For lunch on Thursday 4th May, the children will celebrate with a traditional style street party. We will decorate the hall with bunting and flags and put the tables out in rows. The kitchen will provide a coronation picnic if your child chooses to have a school meal. We will extend lunch on this day so that all children will eat in the hall on this day.

We will also be holding a competition to design and make a crown. The children are invited to bring these in on Friday 5th May. Entries can be taken straight into the hall in the morning and placed in their year group sections.

The school council will judge these and choose the winners (one from each year group). We understand that Year 4 are on a residential so they can bring in their crowns earlier if they would like.

Over the course of the week, the children will all make a clay tile which will be decorated with a coronation theme and once painted displayed around the school as a commemorative school mosaic.

WEEKLY UPDATE FOR EARLY BIRDS AND NIGHT OWLS

This week at Night Owls we have been focusing on Spring and life cycles that happen during this season. We have been looking at frogs in particular and their life cycles. Our crafts this week were to make a frog sitting on a lily pad with a flower alongside it and to make a frog catcher, where the frog has to try to catch the fly. You can see examples of these in the pictures shown. Our tuff tray challenge was to try to feed the frog flies. The flies were hidden under lily pads with paper clips attached to them. Using magnets, the children had to find the flies and put them into the frog's mouth.

We also had great fun making frogs out of fruit this week. The children absolutely loved doing this activity and thoroughly enjoyed chopping up the fruit and creating a frog that they could take home and eat. You can see from the picture how cute they looked! The children have also had fun playing outside when the weather allowed them to.
