

Worplesdon Primary School – Weekly Update

12.5.2023

Dear Parents / Carers,

We have had another busy week in Reception and the children have been working hard. We are really looking forward to our trip next week on <u>Thursday 18th May to Bocketts Farm.</u>

Bocketts Farm:

Please could we ask that your child brings a named packed lunch and named water bottle in a rucksack (unless you have opted for a school lunch) on Thursday for our school trip. Could you also ensure that your child is wearing suitable shoes and clothing to go to the farm e.g. trainers. The children will wear their school polo top and jumper/cardigan for the school trip but can wear a pair of comfortable trousers, e.g. leggings/tracksuit bottoms. Depending on the weather, the children will also need to have sun cream applied before school and a sunhat, or a named waterproof jacket.

If your child requires travel sickness medication for the coach journey, please give this to your child **before coming to school**. Any details of travel sickness, or other relevant information, should be given to the class teacher.

Forest School:

Swallows will have Forest School on a Tuesday and Swifts will have Forest Schools on a Wednesday.

As from next week, week commencing 15th May, please send your child into school wearing school uniform on their top half and trousers suitable for learning outside such as an old pair of jogging bottoms on the day your child's class has Forest School.

Even on the warmer days, they must have a coat with them and wellies / appropriate footwear in a bag which will be kept in school on their pegs in the classroom. Please ensure wellies are clearly named. If you need your child's wellies, please just let us know and we can send them home.

We advise that children bring a spare pair of trousers in a named bag to keep on their peg just in case they get dirty and need to change.

This week

In Literacy, the children have been writing their own 'That's not my...' books. We focused on retelling the story using text mapping. Text mapping is using symbols to replace the words in the sentence to support children with retelling. We came up with actions to go with the words and then modelled using the text map to support with sentence writing.

In Maths, we have continued to focus on counting to 20 and beyond in our warm ups. We have revised names and properties of 2D shapes, describing, matching and naming shapes even when they are in different orientations.

In PSED, we thought about how kind words can make ourselves and others feel happy and calm. We linked our learning to the value of the month, 'thoughtfulness'.

Phonics

In Phonics, we continued to recap all previously taught sounds and graphemes and applied our phonic knowledge to orally blending, reading and writing CCCVC words, such as; strong, street.

Please continue to practice the following HRS (harder to read and spell) words at home with your child.

Next week's learning:

In Literacy, we will be tweaking a 'That's not my ...' book by changing the animal. We will tweak our text map, retell our new story and then use our text map to support our sentence writing when creating our own 'That's not my....' books.

In Maths, the children will be focusing on adding more. We will use the language 'first', 'then' and 'now' to describe our number story. For example, 'First, there were two dinosaurs. Then, one more dinosaur came along. So how many dinosaurs do we have altogether now?'

On Thursday, we will be going to Bocketts Farm. We will have an animal handling session (we usually handle guinea pigs) and have an opportunity to feed the farm animals. We will also go on the tractor ride, walk around the farm and gardens, watch the pig races and then have a well-deserved rest and lunch before heading back to school.
