Sports Day

It is that time of year again and Sports Day is coming up! Our Infant Sports Day will take place on the afternoon of Wednesday 21st June. We will be sending out more information soon.

<u>Curriculum</u>

As writers we have been inventing our own version of 'Hector the Hermit Crab'. Our grammar focus has been conjunctions. The children have been using and, but, so, because etc in their writing this week as well as using all the tools in our writing suitcase to make our writing as brilliant as it can be.



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As mathematicians we have been learning about time. This week we have been focusing on telling and writing the time when it is half past. Next week we'll be learning about money. Time is a great area to practise at home with your children. One thing you could try is to ask your children to tell you when they notice that the time is either o'clock or half past.

As artists we have been using watercolours to create animals to go in the habitats that they painted last week. The children used their drawing skills initially and then used watercolours to paint them. They have been exploring how to make darker and lighter tones. We have also been adding 3d elements using tissue paper and folding.

As athletes we are learning how to move our bodies safely and balance through our gymnastics unit. We are also learning about races and how to run, throw and jump.

As computing experts we are recapping what we have already learnt on coding and applying this to some trickier programs.

In history we have been learning about inventors from the past. This week we have been focusing on Thomas Edison. The children have been recalling facts and then building their own electrical circuits.

In Learning for Life we have been thinking about who is special to us and why.

As religious experts we have continued to learn about Judaism and we have continued to explore Shabbat.

<u>Numbots</u>
