#### A MESSAGE FROM MRS O'BRIEN

#### Dear Parents/Carers,

I am sure, like me, that you can't quite believe that we are about to go into the last two weeks of the Summer term. The children have had another great year and you will be able to read about their individual successes in their **end of year report this evening** (with the exception of year 6 who will receive theirs on Tuesday 18<sup>th</sup> July). On reading the children's reports, I was struck by the values that they are clearly living by each day – resilience, independence, teamwork, curiosity and empathy to name a few. I am mindful that whilst we support your children to apply these values at school, at home, online and in the community, it is your hard work as parents and carers that make it happen. Thank you for everything you do for your children and for your support of the staff at Worplesdon; it is greatly appreciated.

The summer term is always busy with so many fun events for the children to enjoy. We were delighted at the values our youngest children demonstrated at the Infant **Sports Day**. The children displayed excellent sportsmanship, encouraging others and showing genuine happiness when others won. It was a such a shame that we had to postpone the junior sports days – please keep your fingers crossed for good weather on 18<sup>th</sup> July (9.15am for years 5 & 6 and 1.00pm for years 3 & 4).

With sport in mind, we were fortunate to welcome **Callum Deboy (Paralympian)** to school on Monday. Callum shared his amazing story of overcoming a tragic accident and painful obstacles to become one of Great Britain's great medal prospects for the next Winter Olympics. He talked about the personal challenges he's faced, and the targets he sets himself to be as successful as he can be, irrespective of his disability. After Callum's inspirational assembly, he led a fitness session which motivated both children and staff to be the best they can be. The children raised an amazing £1,000 which shows such thoughtfulness to others; it will help Callum to continue following his dreams and the school will be able to purchase further playground resources.



We have also had a number of other events, including trips to Sayers Croft, workshops at local secondary schools, the year 6 production of Peter Pan and visits to their new classrooms / schools. I was delighted to see that the transition days to new classrooms and schools were successful with children excited about September already.

As we look towards **Septembe**r, I would like to remind you that we will have three INSET days at the start of term for staff training (on Safeguarding, Curriculum and Values based Education) so school begins again for children on Wednesday 6<sup>th</sup> September.

I know that many of you are keen to know about the outcome of our **P.E. Uniform Consultation**. As you know, we carried out a consultation process which included a survey and our community has strongly requested that a change in uniform is needed. We have then consulted with suppliers around costings and lead times. Due to the lead times required to ensure the uniform is available for our community and also for us to ensure that we are providing a uniform which is value for money and durable, we have made the decision to roll this out from September 2024. However, due to the overwhelming feedback from parents about the need to change the current t-shirt, we are working with suppliers to try and introduce the t-shirt sooner. Therefore, we are hoping that you will be able to wait a little longer for us to confirm detail which will be by the end of next week.
