A MESSAGE FROM MRS O'BRIEN

Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope you have all had a wonderful Summer break and that like me, you are re-charged and ready for the year ahead. I look forward to catching up with you all over the coming weeks but in the meantime, I would like to take this opportunity to give a special welcome to the families and staff who are joining us this year.

INSET Days

For staff, the term started with three inspiring and informative INSET days. The first training day was led by Dr Neil Hawkes who is well known as an inspirational speaker, educator, broadcaster, author and popular TEDx presenter. Neil has a global passion for inspiring others to experience how values such as respect, integrity and altruism, can enhance our lives and enable our planet to flourish. Recently, he was invited to speak at the United Nations (in Geneva)! Staff learnt more about how we can use our Values-based Curriculum to inspire children to be the best they can be, socially, emotionally and academically. Our second INSET day, led by an external consultant, focused on our curriculum design. Subject leaders worked on their specific curriculum areas (such as PE, art, history and music) to ensure planning is well sequenced, engaging, is accessible for all and reflects our high expectations for all children. Our third and final INSET day focused on Safeguarding and over the course of the term we will continue to share ways you can support your children to stay safe.

We have now set our final two INSET days for this academic year. They are:

Drop off and pick up arrangements

The drop off window means that children can come into class over a ten minute period which means staff have time to warmly greet each child in their class and ensure they are feeling happy and ready for the day.

It is wonderful to see families continuing to use our **Walking Bus** service. We ask that parents drop off at The Fairlands Community Centre at 8.25am with the bus leaving promptly at 8.35am. Thank you so much to the following parent helpers: Miss Rodd, Mr Bispham, Mrs Sherwin, Mrs Persin, Mr Cant and Mrs Wittich. Without this help, we would have had to stop this service.

EARLY BIRDS AND NIGHT OWLS

It has been lovely to have the children back at Early Birds and Night Owls. They have settled back in really well and we have had great fun listening to all the exciting activities and trips they went on during their break. One morning we had 10 different countries, amongst the children, that had been visited. We would also like to take this opportunity to welcome all the new children at Early Birds and Night Owls. They have all settled in really well and have said they enjoy attending the clubs which is great news!

This week the children have had the opportunity to pretend to be teachers and classmates in our role play classroom area. Some of the children have chosen to fill out 'All about Me' butterflies and footballs which tells us a little bit about their likes and dislikes. We have put some of these up on our display. The children have had the chance to go outside and play but due to the heat we have been letting the children out for 15-minute slots and then sending them back in to cool down.

We have introduced Dibley the Dinosaur this week, as pictured, to the children at both clubs. He is handed out to a child that staff feel is following the school values or rules. The child gets to keep him for a while, then they choose a person they think is following the values and they pass it on to them, explaining why they have given Dibley to them. It is working really well and one night he went to 7 different children which was great and showed that lots of children were making the right choices.

Next week we will be looking at Roald Dahl stories and activities linked to his books.

INSTRUMENTAL MUSIC LESSONS

Saturday only, Guildford Town Centre – the Story of Guildford Trail


Have fun on the trail and enjoy finding out about our town's history!
