Curriculum

As writers we have continued to write about Paddington Bear. We have been focusing on using finger spaces and full stops and talked about capital letters. The children have used the text map to do their own writing about Paddington.

As mathematicians we have been exploring different ways of representing numbers to 10. For example, 7, seven, seven counters, seven cubes, seven sweets etc. The children have also been introduced to problem solving challenges.

As artists we have continued to explore collage skills (scrunching, layering, tearing, fringing) to create self-portraits. As athletes we have started to create our own dances.

As scientists we have been learning the names of parts of the body and begun an investigation to test if older children have the biggest feet.

As geographers we have been exploring the difference between human and physical features.

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Supporting at home

Reading books have come home. Daily reading really supports children's development. Asking lots of questions about the text and asking them to read the pages back after decoding supports fluency and understanding.
