Learning this week

In Maths, we have continued to partition Thousands, Hundreds, Tens and Ones. It was exciting to learn how numbers could be partitioned in many ways. For example, 2319 = 2000 + 300 + 10 + 9 but it could also be equivalent to 2200 + 110 + 9 or 1100 + 1000 + 200 + 9 and many other possibilities! We used place value counters and Base 10 apparatus to help us to visualise this. We also practised finding 1/10/100 and 1000 more or less than a given number.

In English, we have started looking at the short film Embarked <u>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=y47-gmGvZhl</u>. We wrote our own narratives, using pronouns (e.g. he, she, they, it), to help avoid repeating nouns (naming words). We have noticed that many children are trying to present their writing to a very high standard – keep it up!
