<u>Curriculum</u>

As writers we have been writing 'all about me' using the structure of the Paddington Bear text map from last week. We have been focusing on using finger spaces and full stops and talked about capital letters. The children have written their own piece about themselves and have been challenged to add extra information.

As mathematicians we have been exploring more and less than given numbers and how to find and represent this. We have been counting forwards and backwards and making links to addition and subtraction and changing amounts.

As artists we have been exploring mixing different tints with paint by adding different amounts of black and white. As athletes we have started to create our own dances.

As scientists we have been using our scientific enquiry skills to answer the question 'Do the oldest children have the biggest feet?' We have been comparing and investigating our feet size linked to ages. We have also been reinforcing parts of the body.

As geographers we have continued to talk about human and physical features and have been outside exploring and identifying these around our school on a secret word hunt.

As learners for life we have been talking about what makes us feel safe and secure at school and home.

Supporting at home

- Use the front page of the sounds mat to practise the phonics sounds
- Use the word mat to practise reading words, they can have a go at spelling them when they are ready. It is not a test.
- Read a story to your child then practise asking some of the comprehension questions based on what they have heard.
- Practise number formation you can use sticks in mud, fingers in sand or flour, pens on large paper, chalk on the pavement or other creative ways.
