### **Residential information and deposits**

As you are aware, the deadline for signing up for the Residential is Friday 20<sup>th</sup> October; we require a deposit and the consent form completed to secure your child a place. We have had a few questions prior to signing up and wanted to provide a summary of some of the questions around the Residential, which we have sent as a separate letter today. Thank you for your patience whilst we respond to individual questions and queries – we hope we have responded to everyone to answer their questions. Hopefully, today's letter will add some further details and clarity for you.

We will hold an information meeting in the new year and announce the date of this before half term.

#### **Next week's learning**

In **Maths**, we will continue with **addition and subtraction**. We will use apparatus to help build an image of the number, particularly when helping to exchange (e.g. in A: 5 + 6 makes 11 ones, which becomes an extra ten in the tens column with 1 remaining in the Ones). This will be recorded with column addition and, later in the week, column subtraction.

In **English**, we will create our very own creature and put into practise all of the elements of non-chronological reports that we have been learning. The pupils will use be thinking about a sensible order to organise their sentences within each paragraph, starting to make use of some conjunctions. These are words that are often used to link two clauses together.

In **Foundation** – we are having our **RE week**, where we look at some of the key beliefs of Humanism – a brand new topic on our curriculum! In particular, children will look at how non-religious people celebrate new beginnings, and we will look at Humanist naming ceremonies. As part of this, we are delighted to introduce a visiting speaker, Professor Philip Harris on <u>Wednesday 11<sup>th</sup> October at 10.30am</u>. He will give Year 4 a **special assembly** to talk about Humanism.

## **Homework**

We would continue to encourage our children to read to a trusted adult 4 times per week — Please can we ask that this is recorded in the Yellow reading diaries? We check the diaries and respond to see who is reading regularly at home. In addition, Times tables Rock Stars has assigned tasks for your child to complete outside of school hours. Please speak to your class teacher if you are unable to access this.
