Next week's learning

In **Maths**, we will continue with **addition and subtraction**. We will focus largely on subtraction, including using a formal written method to exchange. In **English**, we will start our new video of Partly Cloudy. We will retell the story as part of our Imitate Week and begin to use co-ordinating and subordinating conjunctions to build accurate sentences. In **Foundation** – we are learning about perspective, colour-mixing and painting in Art. We will look at the work of L S Lowry to create our own Urban Landscape paintings inspired by the school buildings and Lowry's work. We may have a few aprons but possibly not enough to provide for everyone!

Home learning: Times Table Rock Stars (TTRS)

We have continued to set weekly Garage challenges (30 minutes in total per week – about 3-5 minutes a day). At the moment, we have 12 pupils this week who have completed their weekly challenge (about 15% of the year group). We know that regular rehearsal of times table and division facts is the best way to try and learn them and the Garage setting allows the TTRS system to help target where they currently need the most practice. With this in mind, we are setting a two-week Battle between Woodpeckers, Kingfishers and Nightingales – we will keep updated with the outcomes of the contest! https://ttrockstars.com/
