A MESSAGE FROM MRS O'BRIEN

Dear Parents and Carers,

It was wonderful to see the teaching teams across both schools working hard yesterday evening adding festive decorations, including class advent calendars in every class, ready for children to enjoy today. The next few weeks our Christmas festivities continue, kicking off with our Christmas Fair this Sunday (11.30 - 2.30pm), followed by the infant Christmas plays and the junior carol services. Many families have booked their seats via ParentMail; if you haven't already booked your seats, please contact the school office as soon as possible. Please be aware that we have not asked you to book seats for the Carol Services at the church; seating is limited so we are advising parents to arrive early and to respect our request of one family member per child.

With only 24 sleeps until Christmas, it is no surprise that the children are going to be excited. However, it is important that we continue to maintain the children's exemplary behaviour so that they continue to make the most of every day. As you know, we support your children's behaviour by following the school's Behaviour Policy and continuing to teach the children our school values in assemblies and through our Learning for Life lessons. Last month we focused on the value of 'understanding', exploring how we can understand ourselves, understand others and understand our part in caring for our world. This month we are focusing on 'care and compassion'. In school, we are positively recognising children for living by other school values. If you have any examples of your child(ren) demonstrating the school values at home, I would love to hear about it (via my email: head@worplesdon.surrey.sch.uk) so I can give them a special Values Certificate. In addition, I will be launching a new initiative at the start of next term which is about giving back to others – more to follow in the New Year.

Strongly linked to behaviour is our relentless focus on uniform. There is much evidence to show that when children take pride in their uniform, they feel a sense of belonging and respect towards school and therefore this support their behaviour. Obviously, the children cannot adhere to our uniform policy without your support so please can I ask that you ensure your children are in smart, compliant uniform every day. Please see overleaf a reminder of our uniform expectations.

Thank you to those families working hard to improve or maintain their child's attendance. Currently, our school attendance is 95.1% which I am delighted to tell you is significantly above the national average of 93.6%. As you know, every day in school counts; there is a strong link between attendance and children's academic achievement. Please continue to work with us so that we continue improve attendance so that we meet our target of 96.4% by the end of the academic year.

Thank you to all those families who read my message last week asking for everyone to take action to improve the **traffic issues** around the school. Many children were keen to tell me that they had:

- parked further from the school gate
- ✓ used more green travel
- ✓ made sure not to park on a corner or yellow lines
- ✓ not blocked residents drives

Disappointingly, there continues to be a small but significant number of families who are *not* adhering to these rules which is dangerous for our children. This means that myself and senior leaders have to monitor parking every morning and afternoon, moving cars on from dangerous and disrespectful positions. Furthermore, when children are waiting to cross the road, rather than cars slowing to allow those children to cross, some drivers just drive past. Please can I ask that **each and every one of us takes responsibility** to drive with respect and safety at the forefront of our minds, being positive role models to our wonderful children in our care. It would be absolutely devastating if anything were to happen to one of the children in my care due to dangerous driving or parking.

I hope, like me, you will treasure the next few weeks as we build up to Christmas. If there are any families who are having any difficulties during this time, please do not hesitate to contact a senior leader.

- Light blue polo shirt / shirt
- Scarlet v-neck sweater or sweatshirt
- Grey or black socks

Girls

- Sensible black shoes not trainers. Short, black ankle boots are permitted Winter
- Grey pinafore dress or skirt or grey shorts or trousers of approved design
- Light blue blouse or polo shirt
- Scarlet v-neck sweater, cardigan or sweatshirt
- Black or grey tights or socks (either short or long)

Summer

- Pale blue gingham dress
- White socks with the summer dresses
- Hairbands should be plain in style without, for example, bows or flowers
- Make up, nail varnish and tattoos must not be worn in school
- Boys' hairstyles should not include tramlines
- Shoulder length hair should be tied back at all times
