## This week's learning:

In Phonics, the children have learned; ai, ee, igh and oa and the harder to read and spell words; was, her. In Literacy, the children added labels to drawings and photos of the Nativity. In Maths, the children learned about the 2D shapes triangle and circle. We discussed the features of these shapes and explained them in full sentences. In Expressive Arts and Design (EAD), the children continued to practise our songs for the nativity. On Monday, the children ran for 10 minutes around the junior playground in our Reindeer Fun Run to raise money for Phyllis Tuckwell. They all did this with smiles on their faces, and we were really impressed that they could keep running for the whole 10 minutes! ### Next week's learning:

In Phonics, the children will be reviewing all of the phonics sounds and harder to read and spell words that we have learnt so far. In Understanding the World, the children will be learning about how Christmas is celebrated in different countries and comparing it to how we celebrate Christmas in the UK. In Expressive Arts and Design, the children will be using lolly sticks, paint, pipe cleaners and many other resources to make different Christmas crafts. On Wednesday, the children have the Pantomime coming into school and it is Aladdin! This is a gift from the PTA to the children so we would like to say a huge thank you to you all for this gift. The children are going to love it!
