

Worplesdon Primary School – Weekly Update

We hope you all had a restful Christmas break! We have been impressed with how quickly the children have settled back into school after the holidays.

This week's learning:

In Phonics, the children have been recapping all our previously taught sounds and harder to read and spell words for our review sessions. In Maths, the children learned about 2D shapes square and oblong. We discussed the features of these shapes and explained them in full sentences. In Understanding the world the children learnt about the continent of Africa which is where our focus text (Handa's surprise) is based this week, we discussed the differences and similarities between Handa's home and ours. In Literacy we have shared the text Handa's Surprise. The children have been retelling the story and sequencing key parts of the story using pictures.

Next week's learning:

In Phonics, the children will be reviewing all of the phonics sounds and harder to read and spell words that we have learnt so far, we will introduce harder to read and spell words 'my' and 'you'. In Maths, the children will be exploring numbers 4 and 5 in a range of ways. We will be looking at making the numbers by combining groups, representing the numbers in different ways and explaining what they have found in full sentences. In Literacy, the children will be retelling the story Handa's surprise, drawing a picture of the story and adding labels or a sentence. In Expressive arts and design, the children will be encouraged to make a puppet of an animal you might find in Africa. They will be selecting their own materials, exploring ways of joining their puppets and adding detail to their creations.
