As historians	As historians, we will be exploring the context and implications of World War 2 and how this has influences modern life. We will examine the causes and consequences of conflict.
As geographers	As geographers, we will be looking at how land mass influenced the start of World War Two and the implications this had for citizens. We will analyse statistics in order to draw conclusions about past events.
As designers	As designers, we will be mastering practical skills by planning, designing and making an Anderson shelter. We will select relevant materials to ensure our product is fit for purpose.
As artists	As artists, we will be using World War Two war artists as inspiration to create original pieces. We will be developing our sketching skills before painting and mixing textures and combining visual and tactile qualities to create interesting effects.
