Sadly, we have received an email from a local resident expressing their concern about the significant number of cars on Fairlands at drop-off and pick-up times, parked with their engines running. Please see below an article from Surrey County Council's website relating to this.



'We are all more and more conscious of the negative environmental impact human activity can have on our planet and want to support ways to combat it, particularly when it comes to car engine emissions.

1 in 4 cars on the road each morning are on the school run and are responsible for half a million tonnes of CO2 emissions annually in the UK, more than some small countries. More students travelling by foot or bike, or

walking the last 10 minutes to school means fewer cars outside the school gates. This improves safety in close proximity of the school and improves the air quality for all.'
