

Worplesdon Primary School – Weekly Update

Dear Parents / Carers,

26.1.2024

The children have had a great week showing the value of the month 'creativity', by creating models out of junk modelling and making parts of their pictures move using split pins for joining.

This week's learning:

Our focus in PSED this week was based around setting a goal. We talked about different goals, such as learning to ride our bikes and talked about how we can work towards achieving our goals. In Phonics, we learnt the new Phase 3 sounds 'ar', 'ur', 'oo' (moon) and 'or' and in Literacy we wrote a class book of the Snail and the Whale! In Maths, the children explored the composition of 4 and 5 and 1 less than the numbers within 5. In our Number Talks session we looked at different representations of 4, discussing how the children see the dots which enables them to know that there are 4 dots altogether (3 and 1 etc). We encouraged the children to subitise the dots (say what you see without counting). In PE, the children are doing dance. This week, they are choreographing a short sequence with an awareness of expression with a focus on seasons. In Expressive Arts and Design, the children made moving pictures such as a whale and created models out of junk modelling.

Next week's learning:

In Phonics, the children will be learning the new sounds, 'ow' (town), oi, ear, air. In Literacy, we will be reading and sequencing our new text, 'What the Ladybird heard at the Seaside'. We will be focusing on using rhyming words to retell the story. In Maths, the children will be using numicon (number shapes), to make numbers 3-5 in different ways. For example, the children may have a five numicon piece and place a three and two on top, to show that 3+2=5. Their challenge will be to see how many different ways they can make these numbers. Additionally, the children will be introduced to the concept of zero. This is teaching them that the numeral 0 represents the concept of 'nothing there', 'none'. In our Number Talks session we will look at different representations of 5, discussing how the children see the dots which enables them to know how many there are altogether. In PE, Choreograph a short sequence combining a range of dynamics with a focus on transport. In PSED, we will be focusing on obstacles and support. We will be talking about the importance of kind words and how kind words can encourage people.
