Sharon Girling OBE Parent Workshop-Safer Internet Use

Sharon Girling OBE is a former police officer who retired following thirty years' service. She was at the forefront of a national and international response to online child abuse and developed the processes and procedures that led to the creation of Child Exploitation and Online Protection Centre. Her final role was as an investigator at the CEOP. Sharon is currently delivering training programmes for schools, Premier League Football Clubs, The Scouts Association, law enforcement, charities and businesses both nationally and internationally. Sharon has been awarded an OBE by Her Majesty the Queen for her services to policing the internet. We're lucky enough to have Sharon visiting school on **Thursday 1st February**, where she will deliver workshops to children and staff. That evening, **from 6-7:30**, she will be delivering a parent workshop should you want to attend.

Support-Rise in Bad Language
