
After discussions with some parents about the skills taught in Maths and English across the week, we have changed the layout to the weekly news slightly to be more informative.

This week:

Maths:

The children have been calculating totals and finding change and problem solving and reasoning.

English:

We been writing non-chronological reports on Jaguars this week. The children have been joining clauses using co ordinating conjunctions EG: and, so, or, but

We have identified features of non fiction texts EG title, page numbers, subheading, titles ect.

Across the rest of the curriculum the children have identified the similarities and differences between a village, town and city in Geography, they have built a habitat for amphibians in Science recognising the key things they need for survival. In Art the children have used a range of techniques sculpt a lion using clay and continued to develop our dance skills during PE.

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Next week:

We will begin our new topic in maths focusing on multiplication and division, these two operations can be tricky to secure an understanding of so any support you can give to your child at home will really build their confidence. We begin by grouping and sharing amounts. In English the children will be creating their own hybrid animal to write a non chronological report about, focusing on the animals appearance, diet and habitat.
