



Worplesdon Primary School – Weekly Update

Dear Parents / Carers,

This week's learning:

In Phonics, we continue to review all previously taught sounds and harder to spell words. In Maths, we have been learning about doubling within 8 and learning about odd and even numbers within 8. In our Number Talks sessions, we looked at different representations of the number six and the children explained how they saw the six, e.g. a three and a three. In Personal, Social and Emotional Development (PSED), the children learnt about how moving and resting is good for their bodies. In PE, the children have been progressing from handling balloons and moving onto how to handle balls with control. In Literacy, we learnt about people who help us in school; teachers, support staff, office staff, kitchen staff and the headteacher. We will be focused on writing a simple sentence to say how these people help the children in school. In Expressive Arts and Design (EAD), the children continue to learn to work cooperatively to come up with an idea of what they are going to build, draw a group plan with the adult, build their model and then draw their own plans so they can build it again another time.

Next week's learning:

In Phonics, we will continue to review all previously taught sounds and harder to spell words, we will introduce new harder to read and spell words: come, some, there. In Maths, we will be playing simple addition games to combine two groups. In our Number Talks sessions, we will be looking at different representations of the number seven and the children will explain how they saw the seven, e.g. a three and a four. In Personal, Social and Emotional Development (PSED), the children will be learning to make healthy food choices. In PE, the children will be learning how to move a ball with control using their feet. In Literacy, we will be learning about people who help us in healthcare e.g. vet, dentist, nurse. We will have a nurse visit us to talk about their job and answer our questions. We will be focusing on writing a simple sentence to say how these people help the children.
