Curriculum

As writers we have been writing our tweaked versions of the story Jasper's Beanstalk. The children have been focusing on sentence starters and how to make these more interesting in their writing.

As mathematicians we have continued to work on subtraction. We have been finding 4 number sentences (related facts) for a part whole model and solving missing number problems with addition and subtraction.

As athletes we are continuing Send and Return and Hit and Catch.

As geographers we have been looking at simple keys on maps and creating our own symbols and grid references. As artists we have been looking at the artwork 'The Snail' by Matisse and recreating it using tearing and cutting collage techniques.



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In RE we have been continuing our learning about Judaism.

As learners for life we have been thinking about making healthy choices and choosing one healthy thing we will do. As computing experts we are beginning to make our own animated stories on the chrome books.

Supporting at home

- We have been using our number bonds for addition and subtraction. Becoming a 'number bond detective' by selecting a number between 5-20, getting that amount of objects and splitting it into two groups to find out all the ways you can make that number helps this a lot. how do they know they have found all of the possibilities?
- These are the common exception words for Year One. We aim for children to be able to read and spell these by the end of the year. Any practice to support this at home would be really useful.
