#### Maths:


This week in maths the children have been investigating odd and even numbers and multiplying and dividing by ten.

Here are some examples of the questions we have been answering.

Ron uses base 10 to show a multiplication.


- Some of the base 10 pieces are covered up.
- The answer is less than 100

What could Ron's multiplication be?




I have added two 1-digit numbers. My answer can be divided into two equal groups.

What could Kim's numbers be?  
How many answers can you find?



Miss Hall has some pens.  
She shares them equally between 10 pots.



How many pens could be in each pot?  
Find as many ways to share the pens as you can.  
What do you notice about your answers?

#### English:

In English the children have blown us away with their use of vocabulary when tweaking the story of Augustus and his Smile. They have applied adverbs, adjectives and verbs across the story which has really given their writing the wow factor!

### Next week:

Our maths topic changes next week as we begin to focus on units of measure, first we will begin looking at length and height and in coming weeks mass. English lessons will enter the third week cycle which means the children will be inventing their own version of Augustus and his Smile. We also look forward to celebrating **World Book Day** on Thursday, the children will still take part in PE and Music in the morning but in the afternoon, they will take part in a variety of activities linking to a text. Mr T and Miss Colley will be reading Jaspers Beanstalk and the children will be planting their own beans. Mrs Beight and Mrs Tubb will focus on Alice in Wonderland and the children will be creating water colour paintings linked to the story.
