#### A MESSAGE FROM MRS O'BRIEN

#### Dear Parents/Carers

I am sure (like me) you have noticed and enjoyed the lighter mornings and evenings – we just need to see some more sun in the sky! The Spring term has been a busy and enjoyable term so far. It was wonderful to see so many parents enjoying Parents Evenings and seeing the wonderful progress the children have made so far this year socially, emotionally and academically. Please remember that we encourage an open door policy; this means you are welcome to speak to your class teacher on the door at drop off and pick up, you are warmly welcome to pop in to see your child's books any day after school, and remember teachers are always at the end of an email or call as necessary. If you do email during the day, please remember teachers will be unable to respond whilst teaching so for urgent issues, please inform the school office who will be happy to pass on to the teaching team.

As a values-based school, we strive to instil values that guide our thinking and behaviour. During February, the children focused on 'independence' and explored the notion of becoming independent socially, emotionally, physically, morally and academically. Whilst we promote independence for all children, we also looked at and explored the quote, "be strong enough to stand alone, smart enough to know when you need help and brave enough to ask for it." It has been a joy to see children growing in independence in school but also to see great examples at home and in the community in our 'Giving Back' scheme. This month we are looking at positivity. The children have already started exploring how our values can interlink and know how the power of positive thinking can change your mindset.

As a federation of schools, we always reflect on how we can be better. Over the last few months, we have asked for your feedback to help us review and improve our practice on our:

- Extended day provision which has already been shared and acted upon.
- Relationships and Sex Education which has already been shared with you and acted upon.
- Food Policy and the results are shared in the newsletter below.
- Whole school provision and the results will be shared with you in the next couple of weeks.

As always, we welcome constructive comments from our local community and know that partnership working will only strengthen outcomes for your children. In addition to the above, we have been busy consulting with the local community about our proposal for a MUGA on the school field at Worplesdon. In time, we will be sharing this feedback and would like to remind you that it is extremely important to hear as many opinions as possible so please keep sending me your thoughts via email (kobrien@worplesdon.surrey.sch.uk).

You will remember from our October newsletter, we have introduced a new food policy as part of promoting healthy lifestyles which we received very positive feedback from parents and staff about the aims of this policy and the way we are going about achieving these. However, the section which states 'celebrating children's birthdays with cake or sweets is not encouraged in school time. Instead, we encourage parents to donate a book or small game for the class to enjoy' was met with mixed feedback. Therefore, we carried out a further survey which showed:

- 47% agreed or strongly agreed that children should not bring in cakes or sweets for their birthday with 37% disagreeing or strongly disagreeing and 16% stating they did not have an opinion.
- 90% would be happy for children to celebrate their birthday in a different way.

With this in mind, we would ask that you do not send in sweets and cakes for your child's birthday, instead, we will be introducing a golden ticket which means that the birthday child gets to choose a reward (from the list created by the class) for the class on the day of his/her birthday. For children with birthday's in the holidays, their golden ticket will be given either just before or just after the holiday. If you would like to contribute a small gift for the class such as a book for the book corner, board game etc, you are very welcome but there is no expectation that you do so.

Finally, I would like to take this opportunity to thank you for your continued support and to wish you a wonderful weekend (hopefully with some sun in the sky).



On the day of each rehearsal, students should sign in at the main school reception from 4.05pm. They do not need to wear school uniform. Music stands will be provided.


