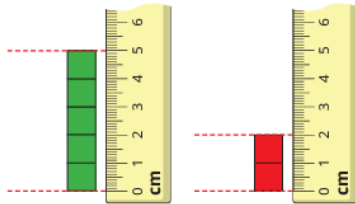

This week in maths the children have begun measuring in centimetres and metres.

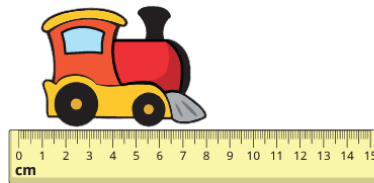
- How tall is each tower?
