ATTENDANCE – EVERY DAY COUNTS

The school staff, alongside the Local Authority, firmly believes that all pupils benefit from regular school attendance. We know that every day lost to education can have a serious impact on children's attainment and overall progress in school, as well as their mental health and well-being. Pupils are expected to achieve 100% attendance unless the absence is authorised by Mrs O'Brien. When absence is unavoidable, parents/carers are required to inform the school at the earliest opportunity and by 9am at the latest.

Currently, our data shows:

- Whole school attendance is 94.7%
- 14.67% of our children have attendance below 90% which is regarded as persistent absence
- 1.09% of our children have attendance below 50% which is regarded as severe absence

If your child has met the persistent absence threshold or the severe absence threshold, Mrs O'Brien will have recently discussed the details of their absence with our Inclusion Officer. As a result, parents will receive a letter outlining these concerns and requesting engagement in how we can improve their attendance together.

Let's work together to improve attendance so that every child receives the education they deserve.

EASTER EGG DESIGN COMPETITION

EARLY BIRDS & NIGHT OWLS

It has been a busy week at Early Birds and Night Owls this week. The children have had the opportunity to enter into a couple of competitions. The first competition was a 'design a red nose' competition which the school council were running. The second competition was a 'design a monster' competition that we have been invited to join by another after school club. It is similar to the last competition we entered where the children designed a pet and the children will get the chance again to have their work published in a book. We will be running this competition for the next few weeks.



This week the children also had the opportunity to paint some lovely spring blossom pictures. We looked at photos of the cherry tree located outside the school office. The children then used the bottom of a drinks bottle to create a cherry blossom effect onto a tree that they had hand painted. The results were very good and the children loved the opportunity to use the paints!





We also became scientists this week as it was British Science Week. The children had the chance to take part in a variety of science experiments that we had out on offer. Our first

experiment was to place a circle of smarties on a plate and then pour some warm water onto the plate. The children then made predictions about what may happen and looked on as a kaleidoscope of colours merged together. The next experiment was to place shaving foam into a glass filled with water. They then used a pipette to drop blue food colouring onto the shaving foam cloud and see the blue rain drops fall from the bottom of it. We also had a dog racing experiment and a fish racing experiment.

Next week we will be beginning our Easter craft activities.
