### This week:


#### Maths:

This week in maths the children have been problem solving and reasoning within our topic Length and Height.


Here is a strip of yellow paper.



A blue strip of paper is 4 times longer than the yellow strip.




The strips are joined end to end.



How long is the yellow strip?  
How long is the blue strip?

There are three teddies called Flo, Tim and Bo.



- Flo is 15 cm taller than Tim.
- Tim is 3 cm shorter than Bo.
- Bo is 42 cm tall.

How tall is Flo?  
How tall is Tim?  
How much taller is Flo than Bo?  
How did you work out the answers?

#### English:

In the children have been retelling the story of Little Red Riding Hood. They have focused on their selection of vocabulary to entice the reader. The children used a wide range of sentence openers, conjunctions, verbs and adverbs. We also focused on making sure our writing was written in past tense, especially when thinking about the verb form.

### Next week:

Next week the children will take the Wolf from the story Little Red Riding Hood and focus on writing their own fact files all about Wolves. This builds upon prior knowledge learnt within our Science topic on animals and Geography topic looking at countries outside of the UK. The children will begin to build their bug hotels using wood and nails and with Geography they will be writing a persuasive letter to encourage large scale companies to stop cutting down the rainforest.
