

#### SPORTING CONGRATULATIONS

Cross Country: As always, the children represented the school so well demonstrating

a wonderful team spirit and joy. The boys ran first and all set off at speed. This course was a challenging one but they gave it their all with many children achieving a PB. Well done to Oliver (5<sup>th</sup>), Eddie (9<sup>th</sup>), Ryan (12<sup>th</sup>), Austin (15<sup>th</sup>), Harvey (41<sup>st</sup>) & Stanley (42<sup>nd</sup>).

Whilst we only had 4 girls competing, they were fantastic. Sienna was our first girl home in  $23^{rd}$  followed by Skyla ( $36^{th}$ ), Carys ( $38^{th}$ ) & Freya ( $40^{th}$ ). The fab four were fantastic, showing such resilience, positivity and determination. We would like to thank the boys for cheering them on with such gusto and running part of the course with them.

As it was the final race of the season medals and shields were presented. The results were based on the 3 races of the season. Overall, Oliver came 3<sup>rd</sup>, followed by the boys' team coming 3<sup>rd</sup> over the season. Whilst the girls were not placed, the boys and girls together came an impressive 3<sup>rd</sup> place (out of 7 schools).



**Netball**: A huge congratulations to the Year 5 netball team who participated in an inter-schools' tournament. Mrs O'Brien was really impressed with the children footwork skills, movement around the court and the control they showed. Well done to Charlotte, Phoebe, Felicity, Harriet, Lucy, Sophia, Lissy & Liv.

**Rugby**: We took 9 Year 3-4 children to Stoke Park to take part in an introductory rugby session. The children we took were exceptionally well behaved, they showed teamwork, empathy and lots and lots of POSITIVITY with huge smiles on their faces in the process. It was a joy to watch them take part showing off some of the skills they had learnt during this session.

#### PARKING

You will be aware of the traffic issues that continue to be associated with our school and I am writing to ask you for your help. I know from my own observations and feedback from local residents, parents and children that there are a number of issues which continue to need to be resolved:

- 1. Unsafe driving (for example: speeding; driving along paths being used by pedestrians; and a lack of awareness of bikes using the roads leading to very near misses).
- 2. Stopping on zig zag lines and the roundabout to drop off and pick up.
- 3. Inconsiderate parking of parents (for example: parking on grass verges; blocking drives; and blocking the school gates).
- 4. Verbal abuse (from parents to residents and between parents).

I believe that it is the responsibility of every member of our community to be a role model to the children in our care; the behaviours I have highlighted above are unacceptable and our children should not be witnessing these behaviours each day. To improve the situation:

- I spend time regularly monitoring parents parking and speaking with those parents who are parking inconsiderately.
- The school continues to be in contact with the Surrey County Council Parking Team to request that their Traffic Enforcement Officers make regular checks of the parking situation during the busy drop off and collection times.
- We continue to send out communication reminding parents of our expectations regarding parking and the requirement to adhere to the highway code.
- We encourage the children to walk, scoot, cycle or 'park and stride' to school.
- I liaise with local residents to apologise for the ongoing traffic issues and to discuss next steps.

So, how can you help to make the area surrounding our site safe for all the children at Worplesdon Primary School?

- Make a promise to walk, scoot, cycle or park and stride at least once a week.
  Park considerately which may mean driving further away from the school entrance.
- Do not park or drop off on the zig zag lines at the front of the school or on the roundabout.
- ✓ Never park across residents' driveways.
- ✓ Be role models to all children.
- ✓ Follow the unofficial one-way system.
