# Helping your child develop a love for life and learning

#### A MESSAGE FROM MRS O'BRIEN

Dear Parents/Carers,

I hope you had a wonderful Easter and like me, you are looking forward to the warmer months with lighter mornings and evenings, and all the exciting events that the Summer term brings.

We continue to make progress against our School Development targets for Wood Street Infant School & Worplesdon Primary School and I would like to take the opportunity to share some of these developments.

#### Curriculum Provision

During our recent INSET day on Monday, teachers received further training on Rosenshine's Principles for Instruction (summarised in the diagram below) with a particular focus on teaching approaches which help children to retain knowledge in their long-term memory.



One aspect of this training was the use of knowledge organisers. A knowledge organiser is a single sheet of paper that lists the important facts – not practical skills – that children should know by the end of a unit of work. An effective knowledge organiser should organise information into categories that help children to understand where the new information sits in relation to previously learned knowledge. They are used as:

- A planning tool, to clearly outline the core knowledge that should be taught
- A quizzing tool, to help children boost their recall of key knowledge
- An assessment tool, to help teachers check whether pupils have learned the key knowledge

Teachers will share these knowledge organisers near the end of the unit of work so that you can support your child to retain this knowledge in their long-term memory.

#### Values

As values-based schools, we strive to instill values that guide our thinking and behaviour; these values run through our curriculum design, our assemblies, playtimes and club provision. During March, the children have focused on 'positivity'. We have explored what we can do to remain positive, especially when life can be challenging including: building our resilience, using positive affirmations & the hero pose, noticing the positives in every day (however small) and always having hope. This month we are learning how to live with courage in our hearts and the impact this has on ourselves, on our family, on our school community and beyond. Please continue to let me know about how your children are demonstrating our school values at home, in your local community and beyond so that I can celebrate in assemblies by presenting with one of our special citizenship badges. My drive this term is to help children understand the fulfilment in demonstrating integrity, living by their values even when no-one is looking.

# Multi-Use Games Area (MUGA)

As you know we are raising funds towards our new state of the art MUGA on our school field which will provide an all-weather surface that the children can enjoy all year round for P.E. lessons, playtimes and extra-curricular activities. Our fundraising for this resource includes: various grants which we are currently applying for, as well as fundraising that we can do as a school community. We're delighted to announce that we are holding our first ever 'Colour Run' (look out for details next Friday) to begin our fundraising for our MUGA. # **Updates & Dates**

#### Nursery

The federation of schools recognises that beginning early years education at a younger age has a high positive impact on learning outcomes. Staff already work collaboratively with local early years providers to ensure a smooth and nurturing transition for the children joining our reception year however, as you will already know, we would like the opportunity to run our own nursery, educating our children from the start of their early education entitlement. After an extensive consultation, we have ascertained that there is a significant amount of support from our current parents to have a nursery at WSI; 186 parents completed our survey with 71% stating that they would support a nursery at the federation of schools with 41% preferring the site to be at Wood Street & 30% would prefer the nursery to be at Worplesdon. Of the 63 parents with a child under 4, 89% would support & use the nursery. Furthermore, our financial modelling confirms that our nursery would be financially viable and sustainable. Since the consultation, we have received confirmation of funding and therefore, we have begun the process of instructing architects. With funding secured and architects instructed, we believe that an April 2025 opening is realistic. Please complete our form (via your ParentMail account) if you would be interested in this new provision.


