We will develop an understanding of how life used to be in other parts of the world and will need to consider how others lived and understand their motivations.

As mathematicians...

we are learning about multiplication and division, focusing on our 2, 5, 10, 3, 4 and 8 times tables and will finish the unit on addition and subtraction.

As writers...

we will be learning about expanded noun phrases when writing based on the book 'The Rainbow Fish'. We will also be watching the video of 'Monty the Penguin' and writing stories about his search for a partner with a focus on using fronted adverbials.

As citizens...

we will learning about the importance of celebrating differences in families.

As scientists...

we will be learning about and investigating different rock types. We will be identifying, grouping and testing them.

As computing experts...

we will continue to use Purple Mash to create spreadsheets to do budgeting and sorting data.

As geographers...

we will be developing our understanding of Europe by locating countries in atlases. We will then be focusing on a few European countries and learning about traditions and human and physical landmarks in them.

As religious experts...

we will be learning about why Christians call God 'Father' by looking at the Parable of the Prodigal Son and the story of The Lost Sheep. We will also spend time exploring why gifts are given at Christmas and what Jesus would think about it.

As designers...

we will be designing a photoframe that focuses on structures that are stable enough to stand for a long period of time. Children which select the appropriate techniques and will be able to evaluate their work.

As athletes...

As dancers, we will create movements inspired by the characters and music from Matilda.

As musicians...

we are learning pitch (to secure so, mi and la pitches), rhythm (to improvise four beat rhythm phrases using crotchets quavers and rests) and performance (to learn traditional Christmas carols).

As linguists

we are finding different ways to learn and recall the vocabulary of colours, days of the week and months of the year. We are learning to pick out these key words in songs and stories.
