Why do you think we make assumptions about girls and boys?

Key Vocabulary:

- **Similarities** – the state or fact of being similar
- **Assumptions** – a thing that is accepted as true or as certain to happen
- **Stereotypes** – image or idea of a particular type of person or thing
- **Differences** – a point or way in which people or things are dissimilar
- **Special** – better or different from what is usual
- **Bully** – a person who seeks to intimidate others
- **Inclusive** – not excluding any of the parties or groups involved in something
- **Bystander** – a person who is present at an event or incident but does not take part
- **Diversity** – including or involving people from a range of different social and ethnic backgrounds
- **Fairness** – making judgements that are free from discrimination
- **Unique** – being the only one of its kind
- **Value** – the importance of something

Bullying

I understand that bullying is sometimes about difference

I can tell you how someone who is bullied feels

I can be kind to children who are bullied

What does bullying mean?

Is bullying different from teasing?

Why do some people bully?

Why are some people bullied?

How would it feel to be bullied?

Facts about bullying

- It doesn't just happen once; it goes on over time and happens again and again
- It is deliberate: hurting someone on purpose, not accidentally
- It is unfair: the person doing the bullying may be older, stronger or more powerful (or there are more of them) and even if the bully is enjoying it, the person being bullied is not

Standing up for myself and others

I can recognise what is right and wrong and know how to look after myself

I know when and how to stand up for myself and others

I know how to get help if I am being bullied

- **What can we say to invite people to join us?**

Diversity
