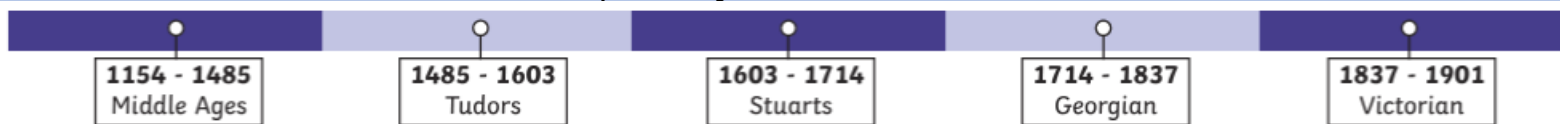


• **TIMELINE:** Where does the Tudor period fit into a British timeline?



Vocabulary

Monarch - A king or queen who rules a country.

Reign - to rule over a country as a monarch.

Heir - The person next in line to inherit the throne.

Court - The household and entourage of a monarch.

Succession - The process of inheriting the throne.

Armada - a large fleet of war ships.

Catholic - A religious strand of Christianity that was led by a man called the 'Pope' who lived in Rome, Italy

Church of England - A religious strand of Christianity that was formed when Henry VIII decided he wanted to divorce his first wife

History: The Tudors



Six wives of Henry VIII: Divorced, beheaded, died, divorced, beheaded, survived!

Tudor monarchs in their order of succession

Key Knowledge (our main take aways):

- The Tudor period is named after the monarchs who reigned from 1485 – 1603. It began with the first Tudor King, Henry VII.
- The six wives of Henry VIII were: Catherine of Aragon, Anne Boleyn, Jane Seymour, Anne of Cleves, Kathryn Howard, Catherine Parr.
- Hampton Court Palace was a significant royal residence for the Tudors and was built by Henry VIII to show Tudor power and wealth.
- William Shakespeare was a famous Tudor poet, playwright and actor.

The Spanish Armada attempted to attack England, ordered by King Philip II of Spain in 1588. However, the English navy defeated them.
